### Track - 1. What is Acupuncture and OM 8:00 AM - 10:00 AM

Jeanette Rockers, MA, LAc

*How does acupuncture work? Does it hurt? What do the needles look like? How do I know who is qualified to do acupuncture? Is that different from Oriental Medicine? What about herbs? If you have ever wondered what all the talk is about, get the straight scoop in a lively interactive discussion meant just for lay people with questions. Your discussion leader is a former biology teacher and park ranger who became passionate about acupuncture after her own experience of holistic wellness. Bring your curiosity and prepare for fun.*

### Track - 2. The Use of Complimentary and Alternative Medicine by Older Adults 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM Tony Kuo, MD, MSHA

*As the U.S. population ages, the use of complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) is expected to rise among older adults aged 60 and older, especially among those with more than one chronic conditions including hypertension, diabetes, arthritis, and various chronic pain syndromes. These emerging issues, which include consumer safety, herb-drug interactions, end-of-life, and coordination of care between physicians and CAM practitioners, will become increasingly important within the framework of healthcare system. Public policy and planning will need to reflect these changes in population demographics, health care access, and health services utilization. In this session, Dr. Kuo will address the overarching fundamentals of CAM treatment for an aging population.*

### Track - 3. Oriental Medicine & Healthy Aging - Natural Facial Renewal

2:00 PM - 4:00 PM Mary Elizabeth Wakefield and MichelAngelo, MFA, CTM

*Experience a gentle but powerful non-invasive treatment that naturally promotes "healthy" aging. This interactive seminar will educate the lay-public about the principles of Oriental medicine (OM) in collaboration with a vibrational tuning fork (sound healing) facial. We will explore the Five Element's, harmonizing the meridians and the role of each in a natural restorative anti-aging process. **Tony Kuo, MD, MSHS**, is assistant clinical professor in the Department of Family Medicine in the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA. He received his medical degree from the University of Utah School of Medicine and his master's in Health Services from the UCLA School of Public Health. He completed his residency training in family medicine at the Kaiser Permanente/UC Irvine Residency Program in Orange County, California. Dr. Kuo currently serves as the director of the Office of Senior Health in the Division of Chronic Disease and Injury Prevention in the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.

**Jeanette Rockers, LAc**, AAAOM director, holds an MA in biology, studied Classical Five Element Acupuncture at ITEA in Louisville, Colorado, and maintains practices in Denver and in Parsons, Kansas. Jeanette has served as president of the board of ITEA and currently also serves as treasurer of the Acupuncture Association of Colorado. Before the reunification of the AAAOM, Jeanette was elected treasurer of the Alliance.

**Amy J. Sear, AP, DiplOM**, is a graduate of Cornell University and is in private practice, specializing in breast cancer, in Hollywood, FL. She currently practices at the Breast Cancer Center of Memorial Regional Hospital and previously worked with Dr. Charles Vogel, an internationally recognized expert in breast oncology. She is a frequent speaker for numerous breast cancer organizations.

**Mary Elizabeth Wakefield, LAc, MS, MM**, was awarded the AAOM Educator of the Year in 2005. She is an internationally-recognized author, teacher, Oriental medical practitioner and musician. In 2005, she created a Diamond Acupuncture Facial™ for the Oscars, and has been featured on Fox News, ABC-TV and Discovery Channel, and many national print publications.
